### **Updated SWPBS Matrix of Behaviour Expectations**

As part of our commitment to School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS), our school has a Matrix of Behaviour Expectations that sets out what our values of Respect, Responsibility, and Resilience look like in action across all areas of school life. The matrix provides a clear and consistent guide for students, staff, and families to follow, helping to build a safe, supportive, and positive learning environment for everyone.

This term, we have updated our matrix following consultation with staff, students, and parent groups. Their feedback has helped us to refine and strengthen our expectations, making sure they are clear, fair, and practical for all members of our school community.

A copy of the updated matrix is included in this newsletter. We encourage families to take some time to read through it together and to use the same language at home. By working in partnership, we can support students in developing positive habits and behaviours both at school and beyond.

### **Emergency Management Drills**

At our school, we regularly carry out emergency drills as part of our comprehensive Emergency Management Plans. These drills include evacuation, lockdown, and other safety practices, and are an important part of keeping everyone safe.

The purpose of these drills is to make emergency procedures familiar and routine for students and staff. By practicing regularly, we help reduce stress and uncertainty in the event of a real emergency, ensuring that everyone knows exactly what to do.

While drills are only practice, they play a vital role in maintaining a safe and prepared school environment. We appreciate your support and encourage you to discuss safety plans as a family.

### Department of Education Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. When it comes to neurodivergent learners, friendships can sometimes feel challenging. They might feel misunderstood or find it hard to connect with their peers. In some cases, they might misread social cues and body language or struggle with their own non-verbal communication. Conflict can feel particularly difficult, especially when big emotions (like anger) are involved. For kids who find it tricky to navigate the ups and downs of friendship, school can feel very frustrating, overwhelming, and exhausting. The good news is: Friendship is a skill that can be taught.

Our URSTRONG Schools see positive outcomes for neurodivergent students who learn our Friendology friendship skills curriculum and whole-school friendship strategy.





### Grade 5/6A


**Neko S:** For always helping her classmates and supporting her friends. You are a kind and caring person Neko with an infectious smile! (As Voted by her Peers)

If you change telephone details or home e-mail address at any point, we ask that you update the school with your accurate contact details as soon as possible.


### **STUDENT SUPERVISION**

### **LUNCH ORDERS**

Lunch orders are available each Wednesday. There is an ordering system via the QKR app and orders must be placed by 8pm each Tuesday for Wednesdays lunch.

Late orders cannot be accepted.





### STUDENT SUPERVISION

All bike and scooter riders are required to wear a bike helmet in Victoria.

Approved helmets have the Australian Standards Mark TM (AS/NZS) 2063) and will be marked as suitable for cycling.

Children under the age of 12 may ride on footpaths as can a supervising adult. They are required to give way to pedestrians and to wheel their bicycles over pedestrian and children's crossings.

Bikes/scooters can be stored in our bike shed during school hours.

Also, by law everyone must wear a seat belt when travelling in a car in Australia.
